She is the breeder, trainer and handler of a number of Working Trial Champions and has achieved National ranking in ASCA's prestigious National Stock Dog Finals and Top-Ten Standings.

Her experience has taken her on assignment with the Department of Interior to work wild bison bulls with her Aussies as well as with the United States

Department of Agriculture to gather livestock for various inspections. She has titled Australian Shepherds in all areas of competition and has been in the top ten at the ASCA National Stockdog Finals. Success in training and competitions eventually led to invitations to exhibit her fine dogs at various livestock events, fairs, and rodeos. Jeanne Joy performed at the Livestock Expo in Tepatitlan, Guadalajara, by special invitation from the Governor of Jalisco, Mexico. She has judged the European Championships at the Continental Sheepdog Trials in Germany as well as presented training seminars all across North America and Europe.

For more than 30 years, Jeanne Joy has taught all-breed stock dog training throughout North America, U.K. and Europe, and has been invited to judge competitive events. As an early AKC-Herding Program Judge and an approved ASCA Stock Dog judge Jeanne Joy has also assisted and coached a number of trial and ranch participants to successfully achieve their goals. Her training methods have also been incorporated into a popular DVD series entitled Stockdog I, II and III. Also a noted author, Jeanne has written several books including All About Aussies (nominated for Dog Writer of the Year) and Stockdog Savvy, the ultimate stockdog guide for herding dogs.
