News Of Note

ASCA Golden Jubilee Progress Report

from Pete Dolan

As I write this we are approximately four and a half months from the beginning of the ASCA Golden Jubilee. Please visit the Nationals web site at www.ascagoldenjubilee.com to see the fine job Karen Thurlow-Kimball is doing.

The following is a snapshot (in no particular order) of the planning status:

1. We have finalized ribbon selection and color schemes. We will be submitting the first order shortly. (Thank you to Deb Adamczyk, Janet Benson, Tenley Dexter, Jean Janotta, Peter Kontos, and Sue Winters!)
 2. We have contracted for all the stock needed to support both the Stockdog Finals and the Nationals Stockdog Trial. We also have contracted for the agility equipment needed to support Agility Finals, two pre-Nationals trials, and the National trial.
 3. We have contracts for all the judges. Travel and lodging arrangements are in place for most judges.
 4. Trophy selection and ordering is in progress with most selections completed.
 5. With a class/Finals sponsorship totaling \$33,350 (Finals total is \$8,900) we have \$27,890 (84%) pledged. The Finals are 78% pledged. You can review the specifics on the web site. We still need sponsors for Altered Conformation, and the Obedience and Agility Finals.
 6. Entries open with a postmark date of June 1. We have a database program for tracking entries. Karen Miller is the Entry Coordinator. She is testing the database. If you want to assist in entry processing please contact Karen.
 7. The contracts for the banquet, the welcome reception, and the "Evening with Ernie Hartnagle" are in the mail to the caterer. Peter K. has done a nice job arranging this.
 8. Fran Swanson is working very hard assembling a nice variety of vendors, and the building is very close to full. There is an "as of May 1" vendor list posted on the web site.
 9. Pam Parker is working hard assembling an array of merchandise including hats, shirts, sweatshirts, sponsorship decals, sponsorship t-shirts, travel mugs, coffee mugs, and several other things. Sales instructions should be available shortly on the web site.
 10. As of May 11 we had revenues of \$22,840.00 and paid expenses of \$11,130.28. The Nationals checkbook balance as of 5/11 is of \$26,485.70. This balance includes the Consortium start-up money and Finals Sponsorships. The working budget summary currently has revenues of \$236,000 and expenses of \$236,000.
 11. Marcy Rauch has done extensive work on the logo so that it prints well on ribbons and embroiders and prints well on apparel.
 12. Anyone with contacts or thoughts about how to generate general Nationals sponsorship money from corporate/business sponsors please contact Sheila.
 13. We have located a printer local to the fairgrounds for the catalog at a good price.
 14. We are trying to locate a reasonably priced cloth welcome tote bag, with several potential sources identified.
 15. We have a source of reasonably priced golf carts. The contact information and rental agreement are posted on the Nationals web site.
- All in all we're exactly where we need to be if not even a little ahead of the game in preparations. A big round of applause for committee chairs and members for an outstanding effort to date!

DIRECTIONS TO TEST SITE: From Rt. 95 South of Attleboro - Take Exit 2A (Newport Ave.) to the 2nd light. Take that left onto Benefit St. At the next light bear left onto Central Ave. to the end. Take a left onto Rt. 152 (Newman Ave.) Go ½ mile and take a left onto Pond St. Watch for the Orion Industrial Park on your left (2/10 mile). Turn into the park. It is the second building on the left.

From 95 North of Attleboro – Take Exit 3A Rt. 123. At the 2nd set of lights take a right onto County St. After the Stone E Lea golf course take a left onto Read St. (There are signs for the animal shelter). Take the 2nd right onto Pond St. Turn right into the Orion Industrial Park in approximately 3/10 mile. It is the 2nd building on the left.

From Rt. 195 East or West - Take Massachusetts Exit 1. Follow 114 A (north). In approximately one mile you will reach a fork in the road, bear to the right (Grist Mill Restaurant will be on your left). This is Arcade Street. You will come to the intersection of Rte 44.
