Record of Merit (ROM)

- To be eligible for ROM awards the owner(s) of the dog must be a member of ASCNE.
- For Conformation, Obedience or Rally the owner must have worked on a conformation, obedience or Rally event during the calendar year. (passed at the 7/99 meeting) (Rally added at the ?/10 meeting)
- Juniors are exempt from this requirement although they should be encouraged to help out.
- The ROM award year runs from Jan 1, to Dec 31. of a calendar year.
- All forms must be at the ROM coordinator's within a month after the show. It is not necessary to submit ROM forms for any ASCNE sponsored or supported events.
- All information MUST be submitted on a ROM form. Use one form for each dog or junior for each event that is
 entered.
- Submit a separate ROM form for Stock Dog, Obedience, Junior Showmanship, Agility, Rally and Conformation.

Special Awards

Each dog will be eligible for no more than one Special ROM per year.

Versatility

The dog/bitch must be shown in Conformation, Stock and 1 other event: Tracking, Obedience, Rally or Agility in the calendar year and receive qualifying scores/winners, reserve, best of breed, or best opposite sex to qualify for the award.

Performance

The dog/bitch must be shown in Stock and 2 other venues: Tracking, Obedience, Rally or Agility in the calendar year and must receive qualifying scores in Stock and the other 2 venues to qualify for the award.

Achievement

The dog/bitch must receive qualifying scores/winners, reserve, best of breed, or best opposite sex in at least 3 of the following venues in the calendar year to qualify for the award: Conformation, Stock, Tracking, Obedience, Rally or Agility.

Rally ROM Rules

- The top three qualifying Rally scores from the present recording year plus the placement points received in these three classes are totaled. The total is averaged by dividing by three. The resulting average determines the top two exhibitors per class and is awarded the ROM for the year. If a dog has less than three qualifying scores, the scores are still divided by three.
- Ribbons are awarded to the dog and handler team with the 2 highest averages in all Rally classes including A, B and C in each level.
- A dog may only be awarded one Rally ROM award per level (ie Rally Novice A or Novice B or Novice C) each
 year. If eligible in more than one class at the same level (A, B or C), then only the highest class level will be
 eligible for ROM (i.e. Novice C, not Novice B).
- The top qualifying Junior in each class is also eligible for a ROM ribbon.

- o 2nd 3 points
- o 3rd 2 points
- o 4th 1 point

The drawing will determine which entries will participate. It will be completely at random among all entries except that Australian Shepherds without titles will be drawn first, then other breeds without titles, then Titled TD Aussies, then other breeds with titles. Dogs without a certification will be drawn last. When the advertised limit of entries has been drawn, all remaining entries will be subject to the same preferences set forth above in the draw for position on the alternate list corresponding to the order in which they were drawn. Per the regulations, please include a copy of your certification, or a photocopy of an equivalent title to be used for certification, along with the entry. Entries without accompanying certification or the equivalent will be considered uncertified.

WITHDRAWALS: Withdrawals must be made in writing to the test secretary. Withdrawals cannot be accepted if the test does not

fill. Notification of withdrawal must be made 48 hours prior to the test in order to secure an entrant to take your place. Alternates will take the place of withdrawals in the numerical order in which they were drawn. If an alternate can take your place, your entry fee will be refunded. Beginning 1/1/2003 for non-ASCA registered dogs- In order to have ASCA qualifying legs tracked and to receive ASCA titling certificates, each non-ASCA registered dog will be required to have an ASCA Tracking Number.

DIRECTIONS:

Mass Pike to Exit 8 Palmer. After toll turn LEFT on Route 32 North. Follow 32 North out of Palmer to Ware. In Ware 32 junctions with 9 EAST. Follow 32N/9E out of Ware, about 2 miles, the Routes then divide, turn LEFT continuing on Route 32 North. Go about 2 miles into Hardwick, 32 junctions with 32A North.
