**Secretary's Report:** A motion was made and passed to waive the reading of the minutes from January 5<sup>th</sup>, and another motion was made and passed to accept them as published in the ASCNE newsletter.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Kathie Chouinard presented the Treasurer's Report. The Winter Blast Agility Trial showed income of \$7084 and expenses of \$5193.29 for a net profit of \$1890.71, Winter Warm-up Obedience and Rally Trial had income of \$1067 and expenses of \$769.95 for a net profit of \$297.05, Winter Warm-up Conformation had income of \$827 and expenses of \$1191.46 with a net loss of \$364.46. Checkbook balance was \$6,644.00. A motion was made and passed to accept the report.

#### Affiliate Report: Pauli Haggis presented the Affiliate Report:

The ASCA *legislative* committee wants to alert the membership to yet another Animal Rights driven legislation that could impair life with Aussies as we know it. This proposed law is called "PUPS": the Puppy Uniform Protection Act of 2013. Opposition to PUPS is being fronted by the Sportsmen's and Animal Owners Voting Alliance. ASCA feels this legislation will not accomplish its published goal of shutting down puppy mills, since enforcement of the Animal Welfare Act, already in law, would accomplish the same end.

PUPS is trying to amend the AWA to allow breeders to sell pups only directly to final homes, removing any "middlemen" and any sight unseen sales. It would further prevent sales using <u>any</u> means of conveyance. This could be interpreted as no internet, newspaper ads, or even phone calls. While the original legislation cites breeders producing 50 or more offspring a year to be regulated, ASCA feels they simply want to get the law passed, and then begin to whittle down the size of the breeders that would be impacted.

This law would make it illegal to properly introduce puppies to new environments. It mandates them to be maintained only on a surface that can be washed with a power hose, and would prevent puppies under 12 wks of age from being so-cialized with pets other than their litter mates and mother.

The law would further prevent any intact male and female dogs from being kept in the home since the same conditions for washing their confinement area with a pressure hose and being kept separate from other pets would be enforceable. Furthermore, breeding dogs (any intact male or female) would have exercise restrictions. The PUPS law would mandate daily exercise, but exercise <u>cannot be</u> repetitive or goal oriented. What are 'goal oriented/repetitive ' exercises?: Agility, obedience, stock work, frisbee, flyball, dock diving, etc.

Even if you think you will never keep an intact Aussie, so this bill will not affect you, consider where your next Aussie will come from. If laws get passed to so regulate the breeders, that they stop breeding altogether, where will you find your next performance dog? ASCA urges you to visit the ASCA website go to the Main Navigation section, under Legislative for more info on what you can do to stop this law from being passed.

#### ASCA business news

- I. ASCA will have a yearly audit conducted.
- 2. ASCA must maintain a list of all fees for services and publish such monthly in the Aussie Times and on the website.

## INDIVIDUAL PROGRAM CHANGES: most to take affect with the June 2014 rulebook *Agility*

- 1. There will be some wording changes, aimed at clarifying Divisions that can be entered at a trial. ie: a dog can be entered in different Divisions at the same trial as long as it is not entered twice in the same go-round. A dog can show in the Standard Division in Regular Round 1, and in Veterans in Regular Round 2 if so desired.
- 2. There will be a new "ACE" Division offered where any dog can be jumped 4" lower that its measured jump height. ACE titles will not count for HOF. Merit lists, or ASCA Finals.
- 3. All Novice jumps <u>must</u> have 2 jump bars (4 for the double) but Elite and Open can have I jump bar (4 for the double). The decision of whether to use I or 2 bars for Open and Elite is to be mutually agreed on by the judge and Trial Chair. The club must have enough bars available to meet the requirements of said agreement.
- 4. Agility premiums are to include a link to the application for Tracking number and service member form. *Obedience*
- 1. ASCA will offer a titling Beginner Novice Class in hopes it will create a bridge between obedience and Rally.
- 2. The obedience rule book will include the addition of General Stewarding Guidelines to give direction to stewards. Stock
- I. A rewording aimed at clarification of the Post Advanced class, as well as organizing the rule book to lace the Post Advanced rules and courses with the other ASCA arena trials and courses. This should make it easier for competitors and CD's to find and understand PATD rules. One change in PATD is that formerly, a club could only run a PATD in conjunction with an arena trial. Now a PATD can be held as a separate sanctioned event. No facilities have been located in New England so far since minimum field is 415'X600' (6 acres)
- 2. There new requirements for submission of Flyers for Farm Trials so the SDC can be sure the tasks are appropriate and proper time is allotted for length of each run and numbers of runs.

- 1. The committee has developed a Finals Packet for Finals judges. to cover:
  - A: Judging and ring procedure
  - B: Scoring
  - C: Conflicts of interest

ASCA will be sending out Jr Merit awards retroactive for show years 2010-2011, 2011-2012, 2012-2013. These awards were not given out because Savings Bonds were not available.

Checks will be issued instead. \$75 for High Score winner and All-Around Jr. \$25 for Over-All High Score winners.






