President's Message

My message this issue focuses on some of the openings we have in our volunteer positions.

To those who have been taking on new roles and the many members who volunteer time and time again, I applaud and thank you.

To those sitting on the sidelines, I challenge you to challenge yourselves. You'll be rewarded in knowing you have been a part of a great group of people, and part of a wonderful organization with the common goal of enjoying our dogs!



General Membership Meeting Minutes of Sunday, September 7th

The meeting was called to order at 12:12 PM. Board members present: Arthur Landry, Gull Gullicksen, Kathie Chouinard, Pauli Haggis, Mike Kurdzo and Kathy Buckley. Bill Haggis, Sandy Hicks, Anne Hubbard, Lisa Haley, Alexis Reidy, Madison Hey, Lois Tucker, Pete Dolan, Deb Keach, Kathy Bishop, Lyn Scribner and Dottie Duclos.

Secretary's Report: A motion was made by Anne Hubbard and seconded by Dottie Duclos to waive the reading of the minutes from June 29th. Motion passed. A motion was made and seconded to amend the minutes that read "There was a brief discussion concerning Harvest Moon Mania" to "There was a brief discussion concerning Colors of Summer". Motion passed. Motion to accept as amended was made by Anne Hubbard and seconded by Dottie Duclos. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Kathie Chouinard presented the Treasurer's Report: Current balance is a little over \$10,378.15. The last obedience trial came out in the positive, farm trial a little negative (-\$67.74). The motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was made by Dottie Duclos, seconded by Anne Hubbard. Motion passed.

Affiliate Report: Pauli Haggis presented the Affiliate Report:

The following is a summation of Motions which have been submitted to the ASCA BOD by the various ASCA Program Committees. The ASCA BOD is scheduled to vote on these items on Sept 21, to view the motions in their entirety they are posted on the ASCA website. Any comments, concerns regarding these motions should be sent to the ASCA BOD.

AGILITY: The Agility committee has recommended disallowing Veteran and/or Disabled Handlers to compete in the veterans division. This division would be for veteran dogs (7yrs and older) only. Veteran Handlers running a younger dog would need to enter the new ACE program if they want to compete at a lower jump height with more time allowed.

CONFORMATION: Changes/ clarifications have been proposed to the requirements for application to become a Non-Regular Breeder Judge and a format will be added to address continuing education for judges.

DNA: This is an emergency vote needed to renew ASCA's contract with Therion since the current contract expired on Sept. 1st. The new contract is for 5 yrs. and includes an initial increase of \$3.00 per test/sample as well as an increase of \$.50/test/sample every year for 4 yrs. (\$5.00 per sample over the 5 yr contract period), There is an additional increase of \$100.00 per month for maintenance of the database/storage/inquiry with an additional increase of \$100.00 at the beginning of year 3 of the contract.

OBEDIENCE: Motions are primarily aimed at running obedience finals more efficiently. The Finals Group Exercise would be moved from immediately after the completion of individual exercises to first thing in the AM with staggered times in each ring. With group stays for Novice and CDX done before individual work, it should reduce the conflicts for a handler to be needed in both rings at once. All dogs will be given a minimum of 15 min. between the end of the first group and the beginning of the second set of groups and handlers with dogs in both groups will be given at least 5 min between groups.

Running order would also change from ranking order to a draw done by the finals chair to be posted at least 1 hr prior to the start of competition.

The Finals Chair will also be responsible for sending a briefing letter to Finals contestants at least 10 days prior to the Finals competition.

There is also a clarification of how ties will be broken, and an alternate list will be developed in the event that an entry cancels.

STOCK: The take pen portion of the herding test will be clarified across the various courses. Also, the rule regarding Panels not to be closer than 9 ft from any fence in the Duck/Geese arena will be reworded since it is in conflict with the percentage measurement of some facilities when setting up courses D,E +F.

BOD business issues: When an ASCA BOD member or former BOD member passes away, ASCA will send a \$250. donation to ASHGI in their memory.

There is also development of procedures for Program Chairs to oversee participation of committee members. committee members are expected to participate in discussion and voting on at least 80% of issues. They are to be notified if participation drops below 66% and will be dropped from the committee due to lack of participation. A committee member can also be removed by 66% of the committee vote.

Library Report: No changes.

Newsletter Report: Art Landry stated that submission deadline for the next newsletter was September 15th.

BOD Report: Linda Gray was not present but ASCA Board members Cindy King and Pete Dolan were. There was some discussion regarding how the members could best have their input passed on to the BOD. It was recommended by the present BOD members that the best way to communicate is through the Executive Secretary.

Sunshine Report: A sympathy card will be sent to Peter Kontos on the passing of his grandmother.



The handler will be issued a receipt by the Registration table valid for sixty (60) days to allow the Business Office time to issue the tracking number. Photo copies or originals of registration or tracking number papers must be presented to the Registration Table upon request when entering ASCA sanctioned Obedience Trials. - All poop must be picked up, bagged, and disposed of properly by the dog's handler. The Event Committee will excuse competitors who fail to pick up after their dogs at the test site or the motel.
- Don't leave your dog unattended. If you must leave, take them with you.

Directions

From Rt.95 South of Attleboro: Take Exit 2A (Newport Ave.) to the 1st light. Take that left onto Cottage St. Follow along 1 mile and turn right on Read St. to 2nd right Pond St. Watch for the Orion Industrial Park on your right (3/10 mile).
